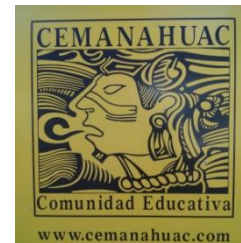

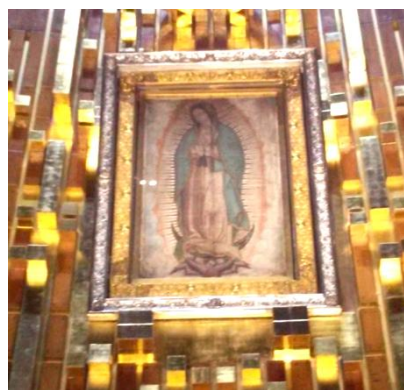
Hasta luego, St. John! (Or ‘see you later,’ in English.) I will be gone for most of January, leaving on the 2nd and returning to the office on January 23rd. I am participating in a Spanish for Ministry Intensive through the seminary in Cuernavaca, Mexico. We will live in the central part of Cuernavaca, an area with a small-town atmosphere not far from Mexico City. Cuernavaca is a very safe city and easy to get around. During our stay, we will live in homes belonging to local Mexican families and will have all meals provided by that household.

Each weekday, we will spend four hours in intensive language classes offered by Cemanahuac, one of the world’s most prestigious Spanish language institutes. The school was founded more than 25 years ago by a sister and brother team, Harriet Goff Guerrero, the school’s registrar, and Charlie Goff, a cultural anthropologist who leads most of the weekend cultural excursions.



Afternoons and evenings will be free to explore the city taking in numerous and varied cultural attractions (markets, museums, cathedrals, palaces, gardens, etc.) or to participate in optional programs sponsored by the school (e.g., lectures on current events and workshops to help children with their English homework). And on Sundays, we will worship in local Mexican congregations and hear about their ministries.

We will take three day-long field trips to learn about the art, culture, and history of central Mexico including a visit to an Aztec Temple, the Teotihuacan pyramids, and the basilica of the Virgin Guadalupe.



Most importantly, I’ll hopefully be learning new ways of communicating the gospel in our ever-changing cultural landscape. Not only literally learning a different language in which to proclaim the gospel but also learning new ways of contextualizing the gospel for those living in or from a different culture. I ask for your prayers – that my time in Mexico would be well-spent, fruitful, and life-giving; and for my family (particularly my wife, Mandy, who will bear the responsibilities of parenting alone for three weeks). If you can think of creative ways of supporting her, please contact Andrea who is actively assembling people to be ready in case they’re needed! God bless! And I’ll see you soon!

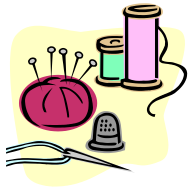

The meeting was called to order by President James Hiles

Opening: Opening prayers and devotions were offered by Jim Van Tilburg.

Secretary's Report

Minutes from the Church Council meeting on October 17, 2017 were reviewed. Steve Siebert moved and Todd Hone seconded to accept the secretary's report. Motion passed unanimously.

Year to date our expenses (\$453,676) are more than our income (\$420,413) by \$33,262

Discussion was held about our decreasing average attendance and how it is impacting the budget, how to make the congregation aware of the budget deficit and what we can do to make the budget deficit up. The decision was made to produce a short video of the members of council discussing the budget shortfall and requesting members of the congregation to consider increasing giving to rectify the deficit. The video will be shown to the congregation during church service in late November or early December.

Mike Overman moved and Terry Fisher seconded to approve the financial report. Motion passed unanimously.
