How was your Lenten pilgrimage? We had 40 days in the desert, calling us to return to God with our whole hearts. Sunday we arrived at Easter eager to celebrate the reality of new life. But sometimes we forget that this season of Easter is even longer than Lent. What does 50 days of *practicing* resurrection look like? What would it mean to intentionally begin another pilgrimage with the author of resurrection life?

The story of Easter morning is such a story of surprise and complete reversal of expectation. They go very early to the tomb only to discover Jesus' body is missing. They are deep in grief, then confused, and perhaps even angry that the body has been moved. Like all threshold moments of our lives, there is a powerful opportunity here. Where you expect to find death you suddenly discover the evidence of death is gone. Where you expect to discover the broken body in the tomb you encounter one who has been transformed.

Even when Jesus appears to Mary, she does not see him at first. In her grief she holds powerful assumptions about what has happened. She holds on to an image of her beloved friend which no longer matches the reality. In this encounter is Mary's life is changing direction forever.

Sometimes surprises do this to us. Something happens which we did not expect and we need to open our eyes to this new possibility. Sometimes it is an unwelcome event like death or illness. Sometimes we seek out a new adventure. Either way, there is a threshold between places of security and knowing, and the unknown. At that threshold we are called to release what we thought we knew and our desire to control what is to come. It is an incredibly scary and vulnerable place.

Jesus tells Mary, "Do not hold onto me." Do not grasp at this new wonder. Open yourself. Be ready to receive the new possibilities and resurrection life.

The call of Easter is a simple invitation: to step forth across the threshold, to release all you thought you knew, to hold your hands open, and to say yes to what God is doing in you and through you.

As you move through these 50 days, do not hold too tightly to what you think the outcome should be. Let God surprise you. Release your expectations. The resurrected life is not something we can understand on logical terms, it is only something we can live into and experience.

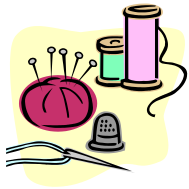

Secretary's Report:

Terry Fisher moved and Lorna Saddler seconded to accept the secretary's report. Motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer's Report:

Susie Nelson moved and Sandy Kaup seconded to accept the treasurer's report. Motion passed unanimously.

Pastor's Report:

- Small groups are starting. Approximately 50 people have signed up. A few of the sessions were eliminated because no one signed up.
- Our church receptionist, Brittany, is starting an "Operation Blessing Bag" for needy people who show up at the church. It will contain a variety of personal hygiene necessities, etc. as well as directions to local agencies.
- The youth are preparing for the mission trip with 34 going so far. The youth auction and pancake breakfast were well attended and supported.
- The Evangelism Committee is ready for the "Shoes for Water Campaign." St. Paul Methodist Church is doing it with us.
- The Social Concerns Committee has the "Egg Trees" up for the Wernle fundraiser. It was noted that those wishing to have their contribution appear on their giving statement should write out a check to the church and put it in the egg.
- Pastor Jeff has a design picked for numbering the doors of the church.
- Cameras will soon be used for a live stream of all the church services through our website. Copies of the services will also be available online for those who want to view a past service. Weddings and funerals will also be recorded.
- We should know by the end of February or the beginning of March if we will be getting an intern. Pastor Jeff interviewed 3 possibilities.
- Pastor will soon be meeting with the remodeling committee to start discussing which direction we should go.
- The Governance Committee has been given one year to work on the constitution changes.
