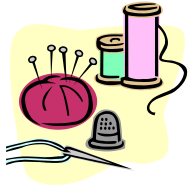

CHURCH LIBRARY *News* BOOK REVIEW

The Foreign Devil in China, by John Pollock, is a biography of "a devil" in China. That devil was Dr. Nelson Bell, Ruth (Billy) Graham's father. In Dr. Bell's early days in China, outside people were often called "Foreign Devils" because of the way the Chinese were often treated by other countries. Dr. Bell, however, became known as "Chong Al Hura" or "The Bell Who Is Lover of Chinese People". Thousands of patients were grateful for, not only his doctoral care, but for his missionary zeal. Times became increasingly more challenging for Nelson and his family in prewar China, until they had to leave after 25 years. Nelson actually had three successful careers: a professional baseball player, a medical missionary in China, and one of the most influential editors within the evangelical world. He was also a great inspiration and counselor to Billy Graham. You will be engrossed reading about the interesting life of Nelson Bell.

 - The constitution will be presented to the congregation on October 6, 2017. It will also be made available for digital download, on the website, and hard copy in the Welcome Center.
 - A follow up Question and Answer session will be on October 8, 2017 at noon, following the church service.
 - A vote to accept the new constitution will be held at the annual congregation meeting. The congregation will, also, vote for new officers. General members of council will serve three year rotating terms. Officers will serve two year terms.
 - Pastor Jeff will have an outline of all council positions for the next meeting to discuss prior to elections.

- Jim VanTilburg challenged all members of council to look and think outside the box to see how the members can help the church grow and move forward, especially as we begin preparing for election of council members and a new renovation process.
